He also represented Lodge 160 at the Six Mile Valley Charity Committee from 1968 to 1990, serving as Chairman for the last eleven of those years.

In recognition of his services to Provincial Grand Lodge and of his faithful support of St Paul's Lodge for over fifty years where he has served in various offices, RW Bro Bill was appointed Representative of the Grand Lodge of Bulgaria in June 2011.

Sam was our friend but he was also a private man and, initially, the Lodge was not aware of his daughter. However we later heard about Amy and from her mother, Linda, who fondly remembers leaving Amy to school on her first day accompanied by Sam. Linda was aware that Sam was a member of the Order but it wasn't until speaking to some relatives in England, who were also members of our Fraternity, that she was advised that the Masonic Order might be of some assistance in helping with all the bills for a growing girl. Once informed, **Unitas** put the wheels in motion and with a certain amount of pride, took receipt of their first ever annuitant.

As the years passed Linda has always kept the lodge informed of Amy's progress through her school career which included developing a passion for photography. In her own words she described how photography **has definitely become part of my life and feel it forever will**. Continued work in her passion culminated with a BA (Hons) in Creative Imaging - a degree course based at Southern Regional College's Lurgan Campus and awarded by John Moore University Liverpool. She passed with flying colours! As part of her Graduation, Amy, along with other students in her class, had to exhibit their work publicly. Amy and Linda wasted no time in sending an invitation to our lodge. On 30 May I had the honour, on behalf of all the members of our Lodge, to attend the 16 degrees BA (Hons) Creative Imaging End-of-Year Exhibition in the Market Place Theatre and Arts Centre.

Amy and Linda both know that Sam's friends and brothers in Freemasonry will be ever willing to provide support whenever required.

RE-DEDICATION OF ORR MEMORIAL *at Ballycarry on Saturday 14 June*

The Re-Dedication ceremony was carried out by RW Bro John Dickson, Provincial Grand Master of Antrim, and was ably assisted by the Rev J W Nelson of the Old Presbyterian Church in Ballycarry.



After the Lodge meeting held in the Masonic Hall, hosted by Redhall Lodge No 260, we then proceeded to the Old Presbyterian Church on Main Street, where the Rev Nelson spoke very supportively of the long history of Freemasonry in the village and for the efforts made by the Brethren of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Antrim to raise substantial funds in support of the repair and reinstatement of The Orr Memorial. A memorial booklet has been produced, which gives details of all six hundred Masonic plates sold by the Province, with a picture of the Orr Memorial and the name and details of the purchaser.

Despite the wet weather, we all strolled up to the old Churchyard at Templecorran, with many of the Brethren wearing their Masonic regalia. Once the considerable crowd had assembled, RW Bro Dickson and Rev Nelson carefully pulled back the covers over the monument and declared this memorial re-dedicated to the memory of James Orr. After the photo call, we all retired to the Ballycarry Community Centre for a warming cup of tea.
