Antrim Masonic Lodge 593

At their October communication, Antrim Masonic Lodge 593 had a rather special presentation of a 50 year jewel. VW Bro Marshall Scott returned from New Zealand to the lodge he joined on the 08 November 1961. After serving in the UDR, Marshall took an opportunity to move to New Zealand in 1978, when a company was recruiting engineers to work in the man-made fibre industry. Wishing to continue in freemasonry he became a member of New Zealand Pacific Lodge 2, becoming WM of that lodge in 1983. Marshall was honoured by the Grand Lodge of New Zealand in 1991 with the rank of Grand Steward and having a keen interest in ritual he was appointed Asst Grand Director of Ceremonies. In 2002 he was elevated to the position of District Grand Master.

On receiving his 50 year jewel from RW Bro Bill Balmer, Provincial Asst Grand Master, he insisted that his Masonic roots were firmly founded in Antrim. Asked if he could offer any words of wisdom for the future success of freemasonry, Marshall replied: *"In New Zealand we decided to listen to what younger men wanted out of freemasonry – and we listened. We developed the order to reflect the modern times and now we are reaping the rewards."*
